


#### <u>LENTEN ADULT BIBLE STUDY -</u> <u>Sundays -March 24</u>

According to Matthew and Mark, Jesus cried out the first line from the Lament Psalm 22 during his crucifixion, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" Jesus may have memorized this particular one as there are other Lament Psalms in the Bible. With this in mind, a Lenten study will be taught

this year around some of the other canonical Lament Psalms on the Sunday mornings of Lent from now – March 24. Rev. Denny Coon will teach the class.


On Sundays, we will look at the purpose of the Lament Psalms, how they are constructed, and what meaning they might have for our faith journey and the church today. There will be no book to purchase as the class will be given a different Psalm each Sunday to read and meditate on during the week prior to the discussion on Sunday from 9-10 AM. We hope you will set aside this time during Lent for reflection and renewal. The class will continue to meet in Fellowship Hall. We hope you will join us!



### Welcome Denny Coon, Guest Preacher & Lenten Adult Bible Study leader

Today's Preacher is the Rev. Dr. Denny Coon, a retired United Methodist minister living in Ankeny with his wife Patty. Prior to ministry Denny was a public school educator serving as a teacher, principal, and coach. He graduated from UNI in Cedar Falls, Iowa, Saint Paul School of Theology in Kansas City, Missouri, and Columbia School of Theology near Atlanta, Georgia. He has served as a pastor in rural, suburban, and inner city churches in the Iowa Conference. He is greatly influenced by the work of Walter Brueggemann, an Old Testament scholar, who published *Prophetic Imagination*, which combines the rich Old Testament heritage with the prophetic ministry of Jesus into an alternative consciousness for our time.






## WEAVING MATS FOR HOMELESS
