As the war drags on, artisans in the West Bank continue to struggle to feed their families. We have received another box of items to sell.

Easter Offering: This year, we will donate our Easter Offering to two organizations that fight hunger: Self Help International and DMARC. Self Help International, based in Waverly, Iowa, has been empowering farm families to achieve self-reliance since 1959. It started by building and shipping simple tractors to nearly 50 countries around the world. Now, it focuses on Ghana and Nicaragua, two countries with high poverty and malnutrition rates. It helps farmers grow more nutritious crops, especially corn, which is the main source of protein there. It also provides micro-credit loans and training to women farmers, helping them access land and markets. Through these programs, Self Help International is reducing hunger by helping people help themselves.

DMARC is a familiar name to First Church folks, as we have supported its Food Pantry with our first Sunday offerings and food donations for many years. With our Easter Offering, we hope to help even more hungry Iowans. The past year has been the busiest one for the DMARC Food Pantries, serving over 53,000 people until September. About a third of them had never used the Food Pantry before. They faced unexpected challenges such as high prices, health issues, job loss or accidents. DMARC was there to offer friendly and respectful assistance.

As we celebrate the joy of Easter, let us give generously so that these two organizations can continue their work to help hungry people, both in Iowa and around the world.
